
THE CHALLENGES:

1 LACK OF SAFE AND **PRIVATE SPACES FOR MHM**

access to safe, private and clean toilets and washrooms for changing and washing menstrual materials during the day and night.



The absence of basic menstrual challenges to healthy and hygienic MHM practices, including disposal.



Bloodstains on clothing and worry about menstrual leaks prevent girls and women from daily activities (e.g. going to school, the market or distributions).



4 OVERCROWDING AND LACK OF PRIVACY

> it difficult to urgently change menstrual materials or clothing. especially at nighttime.

5 CULTURAL TABOOS OR **RESTRICTIONS ON MHM**

> Cultural beliefs may limit the types of materials used and complicate how used materials can be disposed of or washed and dried.
