Abstract (600 words limit): A succinct, stand-alone, and accurate description of the proposed work.

Table of contents

Main body:

- Purpose, goals, and objectives
- Review of relevant literature
- Research design and methods
- Implications for policy and practice in the United States
- Management plan and organization
- Dissemination strategy

Appendixes:

- Bibliography/references (if applicable).
- List of key personnel (names, organizational affiliations, and complete contact information for all key people, including key people from your organization, your subcontractors, advisers, consultants, and advisory board members) (required).

- Résumés of key personnel (required).
- List of previous and current NIJ awards made to principal investigators (required).
- Letters of cooperation/support or administrative agreements from organizations collaborating in the project, if any (if applicable).
